



Domino

28 picture dominoes

The object of the game is to put all the cards together correctly. The first player to put down all of their dominoes is the winner.

Preparation

Shuffle all the dominoes and place them face down on the table. Each player takes 4 dominoes, looks at them, but does not show them to the other players. The remaining dominoes are left on the table.

Playing the game

The youngest player starts the game and play continues in a clockwise direction. Play can only be started with a "double domino" (showing 2 pictures of the same character). If the first player does not have a "double" in their hand, then play passes to the next player and the first player must draw another domino from the table. The player who has the first "double" begins the game.

On your turn, examine your dominoes: If you have a domino that matches the one in the middle of the table, lay your domino card either to the left or the right of that domino card. As you play, the line of dominoes will get longer and longer. If you don't have a matching card, you have to pick one up from the pile. If it

matches, you can immediately play it. If it doesn't match, keep the domino card and the next player takes their turn.

End of the game

When one player has played all their dominoes, that player is the winner.

Occasionally, when the dominoes on the table are used up, you may find that no player can play. If this happens, then the player with the least number of dominoes is the winner.

Note for parents and teachers

In addition to developing picture matching and character recognition skills, this game will help young children learn the basic rules of playing a board, dice or card game.
